understanding mental health problems understanding - mind - mental health problems can affect the way you think, feel and behave. they affect around one in four people in Britain, and range from common mental health problems, such as depression and anxiety, to more rare

chronic diseases and their common risk factors - who - the causes (risk factors) of chronic diseases are well established and well known; a small set of common risk factors are responsible for most of the main chronic diseases.

perspectives on mental health and illness - the main causes of the depressive illness, and may assume that the stress this induces has triggered biochemical changes in the brain, which can be corrected by using medication.
